MAS 501 TA Training Credits: 3

Typically Offered: Fall.

Course Description: This course is designed to provide an overview of Departmental and University policies, regulations and resources to new Graduate Students. The course aims to emphasize teaching practices and problem solving at a college level, providing new TA's with the fundamentals required for their teaching experience. The course will cover the following topics: course design, syllabus creation, setting course objectives, assignment and test creation, evaluation and assessment, as well as intercultural awareness. MAS 695 Graduate Colloquium Credits: 3 Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer.

semester of program.
