# LEGAL ASSISTANT (ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE, A.S.)

#### Overview

The Associate of Science degree offers courses that are designed to prepare students to work as a paralegal, or to go on to law school. The skills the student will learn include legal research, interviewing, investigation, legal drafting, preparation of evidence and witnesses for trial, and assisting in the trial of a lawsuit.

Graduates with an Associate of Science degree in Legal Assistant hold positions in law firms, legal departments of banks, insurance companies, land title insurance companies, corporations, legal aid offices, public defender offices, the office of the prosecuting attorney, municipal legal departments and more.

### Requirements

Students who choose this associate degree program will have no more than 6 years from admission or subsequent declaration to meet the requirements listed below. If certification, accreditation or statutory requirements change and additional requirements become effective during this time, the new requirements take precedence.

The Associate of Science degree with a major in Legal Assistant is designed to provide those individuals who have little or no background or training in law with the skills necessary to work in a law office as an assistant to an attorney.

#### **Program Graduation Requirements**

- No more than 2 courses with a grade of D permitted in major coursework.
- 2. Earn an overall GPA of at least 2.0 and a major GPA of at least 2.0.

## **University Graduation Requirements**
